The ideal candidate will be a nurturing, inspiring, and dedicated English practitioner, passionate about language, literature, and helping pupils find their voice. You will bring a genuine love of working with young people, and the ability to spark curiosity, creativity, and confidence as they develop their reading, writing, and communication skills.

This role calls for warmth, positivity, and a commitment to building strong relationships, alongside the flexibility and good humour needed to thrive in our lively and happy school community. In addition to strong classroom practice and secure subject knowledge, you will bring excellent organisational skills, a collaborative approach, and the ability to guide pupils of varying abilities with patience, clarity, and enthusiasm.

A willingness to contribute to the wider life of Pennthorpe, and to play an active role in our rich, holistic learning environment, is essential. The ability to teach Computing and/or Sport would be a welcome addition, but above all we are seeking someone who can inspire a lifelong love of learning in every child they teach.

Planning, Teaching & Classroom Management

- Deliver engaging, well-structured, and inspiring English lessons that nurture pupils' confidence and enthusiasm for reading, writing, and communication.
- Prepare and develop high-quality teaching resources and learning activities that promote curiosity, creativity, and critical thinking across the English curriculum.
- Take responsibility for each pupil's progress, ensuring high expectations are upheld and that all learners make strong, sustained progress in literacy skills.
- Plan and differentiate effectively, using pupils' prior knowledge, interests, and individual needs to shape purposeful learning experiences and demonstrate a secure understanding of how children learn best.
- Work closely with colleagues, including teaching assistants and the Learning Support team, to provide personalised learning and targeted intervention where required.
- Maintain a positive, calm, and consistent classroom environment that promotes excellent behaviour, engagement, and mutual respect, following the school's Code of Conduct and rewards systems.
- Embed core literacy skills across the curriculum, encouraging pupils to develop confidence, independence, and a genuine love of reading and writing.
- Reflect regularly on teaching practice, using assessment, pupil feedback, and professional dialogue to continually refine the quality and impact of your teaching.



Monitoring, Assessment & Reporting

- Use a range of effective assessment and monitoring strategies to understand each pupil's progress in reading, writing, speaking, and listening, setting appropriately challenging next steps for learners of all abilities and backgrounds.
- Track and evaluate progress across the English curriculum, using assessment data and insights to inform planning, differentiation, and targeted support.
- Provide regular, constructive feedback to pupils; both verbally during learning and through accurate, timely marking—to help them reflect, improve, and take increasing ownership of their learning.
- Participate fully in the school's assessment procedures, including internal moderation, standardised assessments, and any requirements directed by the Senior Leadership Team.
- Communicate clearly and professionally with parents and carers, sharing meaningful updates on pupils' progress, achievements, and well-being through agreed school systems and reporting processes.

Pastoral Duties

- Build warm, supportive, and trusting relationships with pupils, ensuring they feel valued, listened to, and confident within the school community.
- Safeguard and promote pupils' welfare by following all school policies and procedures, raising any concerns promptly in line with statutory safeguarding requirements.
- Support pupils' academic, personal, and social development during lessons and tutor times (if applicable), helping them to grow in confidence, independence, and resilience.
- Contribute to the effective running of daily routines relevant to your timetable, including registration or transitions where required, and accompanying pupils to whole-school activities as appropriate for a part-time role.
- Identify and respond sensitively to individual pupil needs or concerns, working closely with colleagues, the Learning Support team, and pastoral staff to ensure thoughtful, consistent support.
- Communicate professionally with parents and carers, sharing relevant information about pupils' progress, behaviour, or well-being through agreed school systems and processes.
- Promote pupils' spiritual, moral, social, and cultural development through positive role modelling, encouraging kindness, respect, curiosity, and strong values in every interaction.





General Duties

- Promote and uphold school standards by enforcing rules and working collaboratively with colleagues to maintain the high expectations of behaviour and respect that reflect the school's ethos.
- Participate actively in school life, including departmental meetings, staff meetings, INSET sessions, and any required training.
- Adhere to all school policies, including the Staff Handbook and Code of Conduct.
- Undertake supervisory duties as scheduled in the staff duty rota.
- Ensure compliance with Health and Safety policies, both on-site and during off-site school activities.
- Provide cover for absent colleagues when required.

- Secure knowledge of the English curriculum and a clear understanding of effective literacy and language development.

- Commitment to cross-curricular collaboration and a holistic, child-centred approach to education.
- High expectations for oneself, colleagues, and pupils, demonstrating professionalism and a commitment to excellence.
