You will be organised, collaborative, and committed to ensuring that every pupil—regardless of starting point—feels supported, challenged, and inspired in their learning journey.

To teach in Key Stage 2 at Penntorpe is to embrace a culture rooted in curiosity, ambition, and genuine care for every child. As a maternity cover teacher, you will play a vital role in maintaining the momentum of learning, upholding established routines, and ensuring a seamless experience for pupils. You will work closely with colleagues, communicating effectively and contributing to shared planning, assessment, and the wider life of the school. You will bring warmth, professionalism, and a positive presence, helping pupils to feel secure, confident, and motivated.

The ideal candidate will be an enthusiastic, skilled, and thoughtful classroom practitioner with a strong understanding of the Key Stage 2 curriculum. You will be confident in delivering engaging, well-structured lessons that meet the needs of all learners, fostering independence, resilience, and a love of learning. You will demonstrate high expectations of both academic progress and behaviour, alongside a nurturing approach that supports pupils' wellbeing and personal development.

In this role, you will be responsible for sustaining high standards of teaching and learning, using effective assessment to inform planning and ensure progress for all pupils. We are seeking an enthusiastic and adaptable Key Stage 2 Teacher to join our team on a maternity cover basis.

This is a pivotal stage in pupils' development, where independence, resilience, and academic confidence are nurtured. The successful candidate will deliver engaging lessons, maintain continuity in learning, and support the ongoing progress and wellbeing of pupils.

Curriculum, Teaching & Learning

- Plan and deliver well-structured, engaging lessons across the Key Stage 2 curriculum, carefully differentiated to meet the needs of all learners and secure strong progress over time.
- Create a purposeful and inclusive classroom environment in which pupils feel confident to take risks, ask questions, and develop curiosity, independence, and a love of learning.
- Use a range of effective teaching strategies and resources to support different learning styles, ensuring all pupils, including those with SEND, are supported and appropriately challenged.
- Use formative and summative assessment effectively to inform teaching, adapt planning, and ensure sustained progress for all pupils.
- Provide clear, constructive feedback in line with school policy, enabling pupils to understand their progress and next steps.
- Foster key values such as resilience, collaboration, kindness, and ambition within everyday classroom practice.
- Work collaboratively with colleagues to support consistency, progression, and the continued development of teaching and learning across the school.

- Well organised, adaptable, and able to maintain high standards within a maternity cover role.

- A Level 3 Forest School qualification, or experience of outdoor learning.
- Experience in an independent or prep school setting.
- Familiarity with inspection frameworks such as ISI.
- Experience of cross-curricular or enquiry-based learning.
- Interest in enrichment or wider co-curricular activities.
